New Jersey Bald Eagle Project Report, 2025



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Summary

NJDEP Fish & Wildlife's Endangered and Nongame Species Program (ENSP) biologists, Conserve Wildlife Foundation (CWF) staff, and volunteer observers located and monitored Bald Eagle nests and territories throughout the 2025 nesting season. A total of 298 nests were monitored, of which, 251 were documented to be active (with eggs) and 47 were territorial or "housekeeping" pairs.

There were 234 nests with known outcomes (i.e., failed or successful fledging). Of these, 167 (71%) successfully fledged at least one young. In total, there were 271 fledglings documented, resulting in a productivity rate of 1.16 young per active nest. Nests with unknown outcomes were not included in the productivity calculation.

We confirmed 23 new nest locations for existing pairs and 19 completely new pairs. Notably, 2025 was the first year since the project's inception that saw a *decrease* in the number of active nests (Figure 1). In addition, the documented nest failure rate of 29% was higher than the ten-year average of 20%. The decline in number of active nests is likely related to the outbreak of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) in the 2024-2025 winter. Each year, NJ Fish & Wildlife documents cause of death in Bald Eagle mortalities, and in 2025, 50% of complete necropsies were positive for HPAI.

Methods

Nest Survey

Nest sites are monitored January through July or through fledging. Volunteers and staff monitor the majority of nests from a distance of at least 1,000 feet using binoculars and spotting scopes for periods of two or more hours each week. Observers record all data including number of birds, courtship or nesting behaviors, incubation, feeding, and other parental care behaviors that provide essential information on nesting status. CWF staff maintain contact with volunteers weekly, providing updates and are available to discuss observer questions and data. Nest monitors provide dates of observed incubation, hatching, banding, fledging, and, if applicable, nest failure. A nesting territory is considered "occupied" if a pair of eagles is observed in association with the nest and there is some evidence of recent nest maintenance. Nests are considered "active" if a bird is observed in an incubating position or if eggs or young are detected in the nest.

Observers report other Bald Eagle sightings to ENSP or CWF biologists, who review the information for clues to potential new nest locations. ENSP staff and volunteers investigate territorial Bald Eagles for possible nests through field observations. When evidence suggests a probable location, biologists may conduct ground or aerial surveys of the region to locate a nest. Following guidance from the US Fish and Wildlife Service's post-delisting monitoring plan (USFWS 2009), we maintain a list of occupied nests and territories for population monitoring. This approach also supports the NJDEP's Land Resource Protection activities.

Staff work in partnership with landowners and land managers to cooperatively protect nests. When necessary, nests are protected from disturbance with barriers or posted signs. Nest monitors notify ENSP staff immediately if any unusual or threatening activities are seen around the nest site. The NJDEP Fish & Wildlife's Law Enforcement Conservation Police Officers act to enforce protection measures as needed and provide routine assistance as well.

At select sites, ENSP biologists band nestlings that are between five and eight weeks old. A biologist climbs the nest tree and places nestlings into a large duffel bag and lowers them, one at a time, to the ground. A team records measurements (bill depth and length, eighth primary length, tarsal width, and weight) and bands each eaglet with a federal band and a green state color band with an alpha-numeric code. A veterinarian examines each bird and takes a blood sample for analysis. Blood is collected and stored whole (Bowerman et al. 1994) and kept frozen pending analysis by a technical lab. Nest trees are generally not climbed the first season to avoid associating disturbance with the new site.

Results

Nest Survey

There was a total of 251 active nests this year (nests known to have at least one egg) with an additional 47 pairs establishing or maintaining a territory (but did not lay eggs) bringing the grand total of active *pairs* to 298. Of the 251 active nests, 17 had unknown outcomes. These were not included in productivity analysis.

One hundred sixty-seven (71% of) nests were successful and produced a cumulative total of 271 young resulting in a productivity rate of 1.16 young per active nest. While this is above the ~1.0 young/nest required to maintain a stable population, this is the second lowest productivity rate in the past 10 years.




Figure 2a. Map of active (circle) and territorial (star) Bald Eagle nests in NJ in 2025.

Most nests were located in the southern portion of the state, particularly within 20 km of Delaware River and Bay (Figure 2). The majority of nests were located on private land, while the rest were on state, federal, county, and conservation-dedicated lands. Disturbance was an issue at some nests; posting and regular surveillance by staff and nest monitors remained essential to increase the chance of success.

All monitored nests and their significant dates/notes are detailed in Table 1 below. Table 2 is the list of nests that were either not monitored or did not have any activity.





Figure 2b. Inset area of southwestern counties of active (circle) and territorial (star) Bald Eagle nests.

2025 Season Highlight

There is certainly no shortage of season highlights for the year, but there was one particular effort that involved quite a number of interesting and colorful facets. The eagle feeding station that was organized by ENSP biologists at Dividing Creek seemed to have it all this year: a newly discovered nest, rescued and rehabbed nestlings, trail camera footage, angry wasps, and all the dead fish and roadkill deer you could ever want!

It started on April 21st when veteran eagle volunteer, Vicki Schmidt, responded to a call about a young eagle injured along a road. Thankfully, the eagle was **not** injured. However, it was a youngster that had cleared left (or been displaced) from its nest too early as its flight feathers were not fully grown in yet. This was puzzling as the closest known nest was at least 1.5 miles away, and surely this young eagle didn't walk that far. Lucky for us, volunteers Donna and Heiki Poolake took on the task of finding the mystery nest, which turned out to be about 0.25 miles away from where the bird was found, and it had likely walked across an open field before encountering the roadside. This young male, later banded H/70, spent about a month at Tri-State Bird Rescue & Research growing in his flight feathers and fattening up on food. During that time, Donna and Heike monitored the new nest but saw no activity there. So, it was decided that this young eagle would need a little extra attention after its release.

There's a remote, protected area in Dividing Creek that ENSP has used to provide orphaned eagles a "home base" to stand in place of their parents. Eagle fledglings normally rely on their parents for food and hunting lessons for up to eight weeks. Lacking parents, the ENSP feeding station provides a food source, which also attracts other local eagles that can provide young birds with the socialization that may teach them skills. Many hands made this work possible; our dedicated team of volunteers and staff kept the feeding station running for months to support several young eagles. Eagle H/70 was released on May 23 and blasted off with a strong flight over the marsh. Unfortunately, it seemed H/70 didn't rely on the feeding station as he was not seen on the trail cameras after his release. We kept the station running regardless and were able to assist Maryland DNR when we learned that another fledgling was in rehab at Tri-State Bird Rescue and needed a safe release site. A few weeks later on July 2, eagle H/71 was released at the site. She lingered around the site until the evening when the trail cam caught her flying over. But just like H/70, she was never picked up on the trail cameras again. The site proved successful in attracting other eagles to feed including adult, subadult, and recent fledglings, but none were banded.

The story doesn't end there, though. About 3 weeks later, H/71 was picked up (thin and lethargic) in Lacey Township, about 63 miles from the feeding station. She clearly was on the move but still inexperienced when it came to feeding herself. So, back to Tri-State she went. They kept her fed and healthy until her second release in mid-September at Conowingo Dam, MD, where she'll find food and other eagles. In other good news, H/70, the male released back in May who immediately jettied away, was photographed on a trail camera in Long Island, NY in December. He was seen multiple days feeding on a deer carcass, and it was great to know that he was surviving on his own after having such an early departure from his nest. It's amazing to see just what can happen when so many people work together to help out our feathered friends.

Mortalities

There were 79 documented Bald Eagle mortalities in 2025. These are birds that were either found dead, died in care, or euthanized due to their injuries. There were 7 instances where carcasses were not collected either because of advanced decomposition (6) or restricted access (1). Necropsies have been completed on 56 of the remaining birds. The causes of death include HPAI (28), vehicle impact (13), undetermined trauma (6), undetermined (3), electrocution (2), eagle combat (2), lead Pb (1), and neoplasia/tumor (1).

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
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
